

### Help us save Rockville Trails: The Time is Now!

The clock is ticking. Solano Land Trust has an opportunity to buy an amazing piece of property across from Rockville Park in Fairfield. We are working on securing public and private donations, but need your help to raise \$2-3 million dollars on top of these efforts. Be a part of history and make a donation today at [www.solanolandtrust.org](http://www.solanolandtrust.org).

With these funds, Solano Land Trust will buy 1,500 acres of rolling hills, oak woodlands and rocky outcrops between Green Valley and Suisun Valley Roads to protect the land in perpetuity. Solano Land Trust would purchase 330 acres this spring, with the expectation to purchase another 1,170 acres by the end of the year.

"It will be a treasure for all of Solano County to enjoy," says Executive Director Nicole Byrd. "We need help from the entire community to pull this together,
