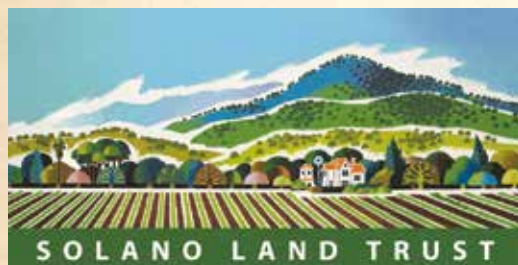

 Tractors symbolize agricultural land protected by Solano Land Trust in partnership with local farm families and landowners through conservation agreements. As of 2024, more than 13,000 acres of agricultural land, working farms and ranches have been protected. An additional 11,900 acres are owned in fee by Solano Land Trust.

Jepson Prairie Preserve



Visit the prairie in spring to witness the annual transformation of California's premiere vernal pool habitat. Trained docents lead you into the heart of this 1,566-acre open space to discover the wildflowers and wildlife in and around the rain-filled vernal pools.

King-Swett Ranches



The King-Swett Ranches offer unparalleled views of Mount Tamalpais, Suisun Marsh, and San Pablo Bay. These 3,930 acres represent Solano Land Trust's largest open space and provide habitat for many rare and endangered species. Open only during docent-led hikes.

Lynch Canyon Open Space Park



Explore Lynch Canyon's ten miles of challenging trails, spectacular views, and deep quiet. This 1,039-acre ranch is open to the public in partnership with Solano County Parks and is fast becoming a regional favorite.

Patwino Worrtla Kodoi Dihi Open Space Park



This 1,500-acre gem epitomizes the beauty, rural character, and quiet splendor of Solano County. Enjoy the blue and live oaks, great views, wildflowers, and wildlife. The Bay Area Ridge Trail (BART) passes through the park.

Rush Ranch



Rush Ranch is popular among hikers, birders, scientists, schoolchildren, and historians. This 2,070-acre ranch is recognized globally for its rare tidal marsh, and is an important site of the San Francisco Bay Estuarine Research Reserve. Dogs are allowed on Suisun Hill only.
